EUGC AND YOU

ROLE OF THE MARKER

If you are serving as a marker for another golfer, you should:

- Observe, as best you can, each stroke the golfer plays;
- Count those strokes, plus any penalty strokes that may be necessary to add;
- Double-check the score with the golfer after each hole (this is not required, but is strongly recommended) and write it down;
- · Total and sign the scorecard at the end of the round;
- Turn the scorecard over to the golfer.

Making sure the scores on the card are correct is the obligation of the golfer, who should check and sign his or her scorecard after the marker has done so. The marker is not subject to penalty if there are any good-faith mistakes on the scorecard.

However, if the marker knowingly writes down an incorrect score, or knowingly attests (by signing the card) to an incorrect score, the marker (if it's a fellow-competitor) will also be disqualified.

If the marker and the player disagree about a hole score, the marker can decline to sign the scorecard. In that case, the Committee would have to speak to both the marker and golfer and make a ruling.
