Minutes of the EUGC committee meeting on 1 March 2019, 12h30, II Ramo Verde

In attendance: Helen COLLINS, Michel DUPON, Christian EHLERS, Chantal JACQUES, Emilio RODRIGUEZ, Filip VERCRUYSSE

1. General Assembly, 28 February 2019

The committee reviewed the outcome of the general assembly. The committee decided that the goldcards holders would share the financial advantages of the goldcards with those committee members, who do not benefit from them. Essentially, goldcard holders would pay 50% of the green fees of the others when playing. No contribution of the EUGC budget would be involved.

The committee will undertake to draft a real budget proposal. The 2019 budget will be based on revenues and expenditures in 2018 and 180 members subscribing. The treasurer will prepare a budgetary document for the next meeting.

Members can submit their ideas for a new club logo until end of April 2019. The concerns of members, who bought a club outfit and were concerned about "outdated" club clothing were well noted. The committee will consider these apprehensions.

2. Programme 2019

The committee recalled that Château d'Ardenne usually confirms the dates of our competitions later in the year. So far, this has never created a problem.

> The committee took note that not all elements of the competition in Ostend were available at this stage. As always, the committee underlined that it would strike a balance between what the host club offered, on the one side, and the "returns" with regard to prizes and receptions, on the other.

The committee regretted that EuropAssistance would be unable to sponsor the Brussels-Luxembourg challenge. It was of the opinion that the prize table should therefore be shared between the Luxembourg Club and the EUGC.

The committee agreed on a new formula for the "Regions' Cup": firstly, players of a team of four would be determined by a draw. Subsequently, the country, for which the teams would play, should also be determined by a draw. The committee chose this formula because in the past only very few "real regions" enrolled.

3. i-Golf subscription


In 2019, the IT-Committee of the Royal Belgian Golf Federation (FRBG) will be managing the i-Golf software. The IT-Committee decided to treat the EUGC as an "event organiser" and refused any further discussion. The President pointed out that he rejected this approach. He summarized the contacts he had with the FRBG, the Association of French speaking clubs in Belgium (AFGolf), and the IT-Committee. He underlined that the FRBG and AFGolf have recognised the EUGC as a golf club and the IT-Committee should respect this.

He recalled that Belgian golf clubs would have access to the basic modules of the i-Golf system free of charge in 2019.

The President emphasised that he would pursue his efforts.

4. EUGC Hard Card (local rules)

The committee discussed a first version of a EUGC "Hard Card" (rules for internal competitions). It decided that the "Hard Card" would be limited to the pace of play and to a Local Rule as an alternative to stroke-and-distance for lost ball or ball out of bounds. The committee would discuss a revised text at its next meeting.
